


From The Editor:

Some Assembly... Done!

When the fellow (Scott?) from the Triumph Club approached our table at the March '04 Board Meeting at Abbey's Real Texas BBQ, to see if anybody in our club might be interested in a '64 Sprite, I decided to go take a look. That weekend, Terry Cowan and I met the seller at his friend's house in El Cajon where the car (along with a few others) was parked in the back yard. It turned out that the car had belonged to late AHCSD member Steve Houtz, and had been parked there since shortly after his death a few years ago. It wasn't running, due to a "head gasket leak", the interior was completely shot, and something had built a nest in the battery tray, but the body appeared to be pretty straight and the paint wasn't too bad. The price seemed right, so I wrote him a check and arranged for Terry to pick it up and take it down to the Toy Shop. I was hoping I had acquired a quick make-it-run-and-start-having-fun project. So much for hope!

The so-called head gasket problem turned out to be a broken piston. With the original 1098cc engine re-built, plus new wiring harness, interior, carpets, wheels, tires and various and sundry other essentials that I can't recall off-hand, I had it registered, insured, and on the road that summer, but only briefly. On the way to soft-



ball in Poway one evening, the old 1098 gave up the ghost, with a slipped cylin-der sleeve and re-sulting catastrophic damage. I limped it home to Clairemont and called Terry to come and get it. Rather than mess around with that engine any-more, we decided to upgrade to a known-good 1275 and got it back on the road in plenty of time for British Car Day. It's been running great ever since, and didn't really look too bad, but I knew I still wanted to get it painted.

I drove it a lot, racking up lots of COTY points through the end of '04 and the first half of '05. When our trip to Australia rolled around at the end of July I decided that would be a good time for the paint job. I chose a dark metallic gray I'd seen on late model Toyota Forerunners. 


Our Annual Holiday Party







providing proof (entrance fee receipt, photo, corroboration from other club members, etc.) to the recorder, Gisela Putzke (putzkes@cox.net) within 30 days of the event (meetings, drives, etc.) AHCSD events will have a sign in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For Multi-Healey families, be sure to indicate which car(s) you drove.

Points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSD meetings, 4-pts, AHCSD tech sessions, 4-pts, AHCSD driving events, 6-pts, Healeys on the Green, 16-points, Calif. Healey Week, 16-pts, Healey Rendezvous, 16-pts. Conclave, 16-pts, Rolling British Car Day, 10-pts, S.D. British Car Day 10-pts, non-AHCSD one day events, 2-pts, multi-day events, 4-pts, Points for other events listed in Healey Hearsay will be awarded on a case by case basis.

The total points leader at the end of the year will receive the coveted "Car of the Year" grille badge for display on their Healey for the following year. Additionally, all points received during the year by all members will be worth a discount towards the purchase of AHCSD regalia. Good luck, and get out there and drive those Healeys.
