She said she was tired of being where everything is either locked or wrapped in raiser wire, where the oldest member of a family may be only nine years old. Aids and grinding poverty are an accepted way of life. When she complained to authorities about conditions, she got a shrug and "what do you expect us to do." She added, even after the end of apartheid, much of the country she saw is in ruins due to white flight. Frances affirmed she was most thankful to be back in America this Thanksgiving, with her family.

In contrast, the Voth Tribe celebrated Thanksgiving and Frances homecoming, along with her family with a fabulous brunch at the Hotel Del Coronado. So what's the point of this? For me it's the gift of family and friends living in a great country, and maybe the luck of the draw.

So...Merry Christmas, Happy Chanukah, Happy Holidays, or Seasons Greetings.



A Basket Case BN6 Becomes A Ten Year Restoration


My Healey saga began with the purchase of a basket case BN6, an error which, of course, I compounded by throwing more money, time and labor into a 10-year restoration. I wouldn't do it that way again, but I learned a lot along the way. I got lots of help from the club, especially from Dick Schmidt, the Luckies, Warren Voth, Randy Zoller and Terry Cowan. My original goal was to make a vintage racer, but, as I continued to throw resources into my Healey, that started to sound like a bad idea (for me). The tipping point was reached when I started pricing fuel cells and found out they had to be replaced periodically. The project took just long enough so that I became older and more cautious - and too attached to my BN6 to risk smashing it up on a race track.

Because it started out to be a racer, my BN6 has an unusual combination of features. It has a 3-litre engine with an Elgin cam, Kirk headers, dual HD8 carburetors, a DMD inlet manifold, an oil cooler and Crane ignition. It has front disc brakes and a booster, heavy-duty front and rear anti-roll bars and Bilstein shocks. For nice freeway cruising, it has a 3.55 rear end and overdrive. It's fast and reliable, and I drive it at least once a week.

Black cockpit interior has gray seats with matching green piping. Note overdrive switch in gearshift lever.

Austin Healey 3000 MK III 1964

Chassis No: H/BJ8 27966 Engine No: 29K96493/HCOD

This car has been painstakingly built to Works Rally Specification. Not only is this an expertly up rated machine but it has its own place in Healeystory. Purchased in 1966 by Peter Smith and registered PS 211 it was campaigned by the owner, on the 1969 Tulip rally. It is believed That Smith purchased the car in modified, unregistered form though in his ownership it is likely that further development took place.

Because of the very thin bodywork, the works chassis and the aluminium cylinder head the weight of the car has decreased by 120 kg. A original works engine with 210 bhp. makes it a very powerful car.

It has the original works colours: red with a white hard top and the car stands on period correct Minilites. The many modifications and the almost complete inventarisation of original competition parts such as the adjustable shock absorbers, side exit exhaust and the interior in the style of the Works Healeys, make this car very special and unique.

In 1970 a Mr Price purchased the car with many competition spares and re-registered it (SEU 63D) before taking it off the road in 1973. The MoT certificates with the car indicate it has covered only 20,500 miles when I bought this Healey in 1996 and registered the car in Holland with the plates: DM-65-74.

As far as known, this is the only Healey in Holland with such an original rally specification. During my ownership there came a few changes like an alternator witch is according Dutch Fifa-rules. Also the brake- and steering system is separated for safety reason.

Conclave, Chuck Anderson - Club Insurance New Officers & Committee Chairs: Carl Brown - President, Jim Frakes - V.P. Conclave, Fred Dabney - Club Insurance

All club delegates in attendance gave their annual club reports on club size, account balances, best activities & social events for 2006. AHCA membership is currently 3605 and the '07 membership renewals are going out Thanksgiving week. Bill Ebersole, Chair of the '06 Ohio Conclave submitted final reports...the Conclave was a success! 186 registrants (maybe due to sub-par weather), \$2800 profit from regalia sales, and \$4883 in profit from the event, to be split with AHCA. After some discussion about the geographic location in regards to the "08 Conclave in San Diego, and the progress of the planning for the '09 Conclave, which was slated for Taos, New Mexico, the delegates voted to postpone Taos and instead accept a bid from the Southern Ontario Club to host in '09. Fred Dabney gave an hour presentation with Q&A regarding the club insurance and how it should be utilized and which events should be reported to AHCA. Fred advised all Conclave host clubs to form a corporation to limit liability.

Several other issues were discussed and voted on as follows: MMSP to increase "Healey Marque" magazine from 36 to 40 pages; MMSP to start using online credit card and Pay-Pal for membership renewal; MMSF to start poly-bagging "Healey Marque" in '07 (will investigate ways of off-setting costs through advertising); MMSP to not increase membership dues for '07; MMSP to accept '07 "deficit" budget.

Saturday evening auction raised \$1182 to help off-set the cost of the delegates meeting. Next delegates meeting to be held at the '07 Conclave in Burlington, VT.






