





in the mouth with a Trader Joe's French Truffle (no, it's not a mushroom).

Lunch is at the Falkner Winery. Falkner's has a great restaurant, staged amongst beautiful modern Tuscan architecture. The site is perched on a hillside overlooking new vineyards and a dramatic view of the Temecula valley. We didn't taste there, but a glass of their chardonnay made my lunch memorable.

Lunch was followed by a tasting at Longshadow Ranch Winery. Their offerings seemed as rustic as their establishment, but interesting never the less. Their greeter was passed out in the sawdust by the bar when we arrived. We just stepped over him.

The Longshadow interlude led to more serious varietals at the-



# Bob & Barbara Humphreys **1974 Jensen Healey**

I have owned a British Sports Car almost continually since 1961, when I purchased my boss's 1960 Austin Healey 3000. The only time I didn't have one was during the period I was on active duty with the Navy and I was stationed overseas. Soon after I left active duty, we purchased an MGB.

When the Jensen Healey came out in 1973, I fell in love with the clean lines of the car and immediately wanted one. I liked the high-revving power of the 2-liter, 140 HP Lotus dual overhead cam, 4-valve engine, the smooth shifting transmission and the great handling. The relatively high cost prevented the purchase at that time; although I did take a number of test-drives. It wasn't until 1979 that I found a 1974 model, low-mileage, car in very good condition and we were in a position to acquire it. We saw an ad in the paper and decided to just go look at it. The price was reasonable and we bought it right there and then.

Our car is a transition model. It has the 4-speed transmission of the steel bumper cars and the rubber bumpers and interior of the later 5-speed cars. It is relatively rare as only about 250 of the type were built. The advantage of the 1974 model was the clean burning engine that did not require the catalytic converter that was required on almost all other cars produced that year. It could burn regular leaded gas, but was set up to use unleaded gas, if necessary.

The car was a daily driver for a number of years. Barbara would often load it up with the two children, boogie boards and beach chairs and head to the beach for the day. I would drive it to work when I had the opportunity.

After the children outgrew the back shelf and we obtained a second larger car, the Jensen Healey began to spend more time in the garage and was eventually relegated to weekend use and occasional trips to work on nice days.

The car now has only 62,000 miles and is still almost all original. It still has the original top and interior. The only modifications are a new radio with cassette player to replace the original Jensen Healey brand 8-track, which we still have, and an electronic ignition. We did have it repainted in 1994, as the paint was getting a little dull after 20 years.

We have driven the car to a number of long distance events. The longest was to the West Coast Meet in Silver Star, Brit-

ish Columbia. The after-tour took us through British Columbia, Montana, Idaho, Oregon and Washington. We drove over 5000 miles and only had some minor problems, which were fixed well enough to permit us to continue on until we returned home. Barb developed an insulation pad to



place under the top in order to keep out the high heat of the desert. The pad works so well that we made a similar one for the Austin Healey. It is invisible under normal conditions.

During the 27 years that we have owned the car, it has required little more than routine maintenance and we continue to enjoy the power and good handling that only a Healey designed automobile can provide.

When we joined the AHCSD, we had the only Jensen Healey in the group. The club members accepted us with open arms. We did have a few problems with other Healey clubs when we began to show the car at some of their meets. Some club members didn't quite believe it to be a "Real Healey". However, since Donald and Geoff Healey were involved with the design and manufacture of the car, over time, the Jensen Healey has been accepted as the last in a long line of Healey Sports Cars that fulfill the mystique of the Healey name.





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

The total points leader at the end of the year will receive the coveted "Car of the Year" grille badge for display on their Healey for the following year. Additionally, all points received during the year by all members will be worth a discount towards the purchase of AHCSD regalia. Good luck, and get out there and drive those Healeys.


