





Bratmiester John Schermerhorn was doing his magic at the barbecue as always.



British Car Day & Rolling B.C.D.10 pts, Other non-AHCSD one-day events 2 pts, Other non-AHCSD multi-day events 4 pts, The Board on a case-by-case basis may award points for other events.


