


Campo Train Ride and Museum Tour







CotY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSD Meetings & Tech Sessions 4 pts, AHCSD Driving Events, Parties, etc. 6 pts, California Healey Week 16 pts, Healey Rendezvous 16 pts, Austin Healey Conclave 16 pts, S.D. British Car Day & Rolling B.C.D.10 pts, Other non-AHCSD one-day events 2 pts, Other non-AHCSD=2 0multi-day events 4 pts, The Board on a case-by-case basis may award points for other events.


