




If you are ever in the S.F. Bay area you should put the Blackhawk Museum on your list of to do items. The write up from their web site is a wonderful description of what the museum has to offer:



"The Blackhawk Museum's automotive exhibition of *International Automotive Treasures*TM presents and displays historically significant and artistically inspired automobiles from the very earliest to the contemporary for public enjoyment and educational enrichment.

In every era there have been cars of special artistic and historic significance built to illustrate new ideas in styling, engineering or performance, or to satisfy a famous celebrity's individual taste. Many cars are one-of-a-kind "rolling sculptures" conceived by the world's leading designers and crafted by the most respected coachbuilding artisans. The exhibition presents over 90 of these great cars as *individual works of art.*"http://www.blackhawkmuseum.org/

Like most museums they rotate at least part of their collect. From several visits I have been able to see Tucker's, all three of the Alfa Romeo B.A.T. cars, Healeys, Aston Martin Zagotos and Delahays just as part of the



rotating display. The museum it self is almost a match for the cars yet does not compete for attention. The polished black granite floor and black cloth walls make for a real challenge to photograph the cars however. Oh an be sure to visit the couple of rooms filled with automotive art. The Museum is

located in Danville, east of Oakland off of I-680.

A TECHNICAL ARTICLE "HOW TO REBUILD SU CARBS" A NEW PERSPECTIVE

California Healey Week



This year the Austin Healey Association will host California Healey Week in Paso Robles, gateway to the Central Coast's Wine Country. Nestled in the green and golden rolling hills of the upper Salinas River Valley, Paso Robles is a blend of cultures. It is a small city with a long standing ability to be many things to many people. Catering to sophisticated tastes with gourmet restaurants and quality boutiques, the community also suits those who seek a picturesque retreat with its vast landscape of rolling woodland. It's amiable small-town flavor, fertile soil, and Victorian charm strike a chord in the hearts of all who visit.

Primarily a farming community for many decades, the Rancho Paso de Robles (Spanish for "Pass of Oaks") was created as part of a Spanish land grant in 1844. In the years to follow Daniel Blackburn became owner of the land that would become the site of the future town. Drury James, the uncle of the outlaw Jesse James became a partner with Blackburn following the end of the Civil War. The first El Paso De Robles Hotel was constructed in 1864, and in 1889 a new magnificent Hotel was built. By the turn of the century the Inn was catering to world travelers. In December 1940; tragedy struck....A spectacular fire completely destroyed what was thought to be a "fire-proof" structure. By February 1942 the Hotel was rebuilt and opened for business once more. In 1999 the Inn was purchased by Martin Resorts, a local family owned corporation and a multi-phased plan was begun to restore the Hotel to it's turn-of-the-century grandeur with many improvements.

Our Event begins with early arrivals driving up the coast on Wednesday. Thursday we are planning a drive and tech session with an area Healey Specialist or if you prefer tour some of the local museums and attractions.. Friday will offer a choice of a drive to the coast or a tour of a local winery with lunch, followed by a tech session and ladies craft session at the Hotel. Saturday starts out with our traditional car show with some unique awards in addition to the usual classes. There will be a short drive in the local area followed by a guest speaker, cocktail party and banquet at the Hotel. Departure will be Sunday for most attendees unless an extended stay has been arraigned.

Please make your reservations as soon as possible as we have a limited number of rooms at the discounted rate. Check out the Schedule of Events for more detail. commerce, charities) where you participate with your Healey. These events may or may not be listed in the newsletter. The participant is responsible for providing proof of participation (entrance fee receipt, photo, corroboration from other club members etc.) to the CotY recorder, Gisela Putzke (858-486-3870 or <u>putzke@cox.net</u>), within 30 days after the event. AHCSD events will have a sign-in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For multi-Healey families, be sure to indicate which car(s) you drove.

CotY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSD Meetings & Tech Sessions 4 pts; AHCSD driving Events, Parties etc. 6 pts; California HEaley Week 16 pts; Healey Rendezvous 16 pts; Austin Healey Conclave 16 pts; S.D. British Car Day & Rolling B.C.D. 10 pts; Other non-AHCSD one day events 2 pts; Other non-AHCSD multi-day events 4pts. The Board on a case-by-case basis may award points for other events.


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


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
