

Aztec Racing

The New York Auto Show opened this week and a virtual plethora of engineering innovation was put on display. How in the world did they come up with all those ideas? Well, last Saturday we saw a seed pod of all that innovation. We toured the head quarters of the Aztec Racing Team at SDSU (San Diego State University). Here a team of young engineering students takes theories and turns them into a car they will race at the California Speedway sometime in mid June.

We looked at a chassis and engine mock up on a table in the middle of the room and parts scattered all over the place. Carbon fiber intake manifolds and a



steering wheel lay on one table along with the rear suspension

module. In another room sat a pile of styrofoam looking stuff that was threaded on a piece of PVC pipe. We were told it was the mold for the carbon fiber body shell. On a computer we saw a 3D display of the whole exhaust manifold.

The students actually design the whole car on a computer, test the design and then build it by creating all the elements of the design. Different students blend all their skills designing, fabricating, cutting, welding, strategizing, promoting and driving.

Leaving there we headed to Mt. Soledad for lunch and an incredible view.

In Memoriam

Norman Nock

t is with much sorrow that we announce the passing of Norman Nock, a lifetime member of both the Austin Healey Club of America and Austin Healey Club USA. He passed away on April 13, 2010, at home, surrounded by his family.

As a teenager in Birmingham, England, Norman served his apprenticeship with Lucas in the racing division, and had the honor of working on Juan Fangio's V16 BRM racecar, keeping the complicated ignition system working smoothly.

He went to Canada as the Lucas representative. While there, Norman met and married his wife Shona. In 1957, they moved to San Francisco where he opened his first shop in 1958.

Norman's first Healey was a BN4 that he used as a daily driver up until 1968. In 1971, Norman had the opportunity to open a new British car dealership, so he packed up his family, which now included son David, and daughter Sheila, and the business, and moved to Stockton, California, where he opened British Car Specialists, which remains an ongoing and successful business.

In 1979, he purchased a worn-out 1956 BN2 that he and Shona restored at home. They drove this car to many Healey meets all over the Western United States, putting on over 100,000 miles. Norman also restored a 1962 BN7 Tri Carb at home, putting many miles on that car as well.

As the production of new British sports cars came to an end, Norman put all of his efforts into keeping the cars that he loved so much on the road, so that everyone could enjoy them. Norman shared his knowledge willingly with everyone, writing numerous technical articles and even producing his own book of the collection of these articles. You could always expect a large audience at one of Norman's many tech sessions.

Norman stayed active right up until the end, riding his bike, snow skiing, playing the piano, and along with Shona, playing an active role in Healey events. He was never too far from his beloved Healeys or from his loving wife, children, grandchildren Andrew, Jennifer, and Laura, and great-grandchildren Dylan, Benjamyn, and William. His children, David and Sheila, will continue his legacy at British Car Specialists in Stockton, California.

Norman added immeasurably to so many lives. He will be missed for his friendship, his readiness to help, and for his willingness to share his vast knowledge



CotY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSD Meetings & Tech Sessions 4 pts; AHCSD driving Events, Parties etc. 6 pts; California Healey Week 16 pts; Healey Rendezvous 16 pts; Austin Healey Conclave 16 pts; S.D. British Car Day & Rolling B.C.D. 10 pts; Other non-AHCSD one day events 2 pts; Other non-AHCSD multi-day events 4pts. The Board on a case-by-case basis may award points for other events.


