Well, looks like we are starting to see the end of the tunnel for John & Mary's Sprite Project. They are both ready to stop buying parts and




start driving them around !! Howard made some progress on his 3000 while learning once again how bad some of the parts we are supplied really are !!

Most of them presented difficulty for me getting in and getting out. None-the-less, I suffer the discomfort of ingress/egress for the joy of wrapping myself in well designed sheet metal eye candy.

My Sprite does, however, pose a major difficulty. The steering wheel is too big for me. I cannot fit under it nor drive the car safely. So, I bought a smaller wheel. That works fine with two exceptions. First, with the smaller wheel the car responds to the slightest move of the wheel. Sometimes I feel like I don't even have to turn the wheel. I just have to think 'go left' and the car will turn. It makes you very careful with the steering. Second, the smaller wheel blocks the view of the gauges. I cannot see the speedo because of the wheel. Not a major problem, but "officer I couldn't see how fast I was going" doesn't help with the speeding ticket. My solution? A cutaway wheel. I took a hack saw to the wheel and took out a notch so I could see the speedo. I can now stay within the law and it looks pretty racy too. I have the only Sprite in the world with a cut away steering wheel. Whooeee!!

with Nash,


Packard, Studebaker, Imperial, and Plymouth. Still no other Healeys, in fact, only three British cars could be found.

unusual Mercedes


transporter and one used by Ferrari.

A driving tour to the Thompson's Mill and an auction of Healey memorabilia completed the days activities.

About a week and a half before competition a few students were testing the car and it suffered some major damage to the right side of the suspension and chassis. The team rallied together and we rebuilt the car in time to go to competition but we had no chance to test after that

Going into competition without testing was really hard but the team was able to get the car past tech inspection in time for the main endurance event. The first driver in the car was able to turn an incredibly fast lap time on only his fourth lap,




probably top 10 or 15 in the competition. Unfortunately the lack of 'seat time' in the car inevitably came back to hurt us.

On his fifth lap, the driver spun out entering the trickiest portion of the course and the engine would not restart (probably due to flooding of the

engine). The tow vehicle moved the car off course, and that was it for the dynamic portion of the event.

BUT, we had a pretty good showing in the static portions of the event. The team finished 5th in cost, meaning that we budgeted our funds very well and built an awesome car with the least money we could. We also placed well in the business portion of the event.

Overall it was an awesome experience and we ALL learned a lot. Not to mention it was a blast to be around awesome race cars for four days!

Editor's Note:

I visited the Aztec Racing headquarters to talk to the team about their competition in Fontana. I wanted to see the car and

talk to the team about their experience.

They were disappointed about the mishap but felt they had done really well by putting the car back together in a week and a half and do as well as they did. They learned a lot and are looking forward to the competition next year.

I asked, "What's next?" They said, "testing, testing, testing." When I asked what that meant, they

said, "We'll take the car out and try to break it." Between now and the next competition they will do everything they can to find out where the weak points are and what it will take to correct them. As much



fun as they had in Fontana, I think they will really enjoy themselves as they search for the razor's edge.

When I asked about the business end of the project we talked about their budget and how much they had to work with. SDSU fronts them about \$3K and they raise the rest. This year they built this car with a total budget of around \$15K. That takes on new meaning when you remember they were up against teams who started with a \$50K head start.

I think they did pretty well!




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
CAR OF THE YEAR AWARD

In an effort to recognize Club members who participate with their Healeys, the Austin Healey Club of San Diego awards Car of the Year (COTY) points for various activities. Opportunities to collect CotY points include any car-related events (shows, drives, rallies, etc.) sponsored by an official organization (other car clubs, auto museum, city chambers of

commerce, charities) where you participate with your Healey. These events may or may not be listed in the newsletter. The participant is responsible for providing proof of participation (entrance fee receipt, photo, corroboration from other club members etc.) to the CotY recorder, Gisela Putzke (858-486-3870 or putzke@cox.net), within 30 days after the event. AHCSD events will have a sign-in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For multi-Healey families, be sure to indicate which car(s) you drove.

CotY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSD Meetings & Tech Sessions 4 pts; AHCSD driving Events, Parties etc. 6 pts; California Healey Week 16 pts; Healey Rendezvous 16 pts; Austin Healey Conclave 16 pts; S.D. British Car Day & Rolling B.C.D. 10 pts; Other non-AHCSD one day events 2 pts; Other non-AHCSD multi-day events 4pts. The Board on a case-by-case basis may award points for other events.



electricals also happened. Somewhere in there Mary,




Gisela, Lynne, Allie, and Jan got our potluck lunch going and we quit for a bit.
