Now in 2011 he was once again on a very large paved open space surrounded by 100s of old cars of British design. This time he had brought his nearly newly finished (after more than 30 years of waiting and sanding and moaning and cursing under his breath) 1963 Austin Healey Sprite to show all those who care to look at it.

If nothing else the world had a very good example of those days of youth and hope and desire, and perhaps, just maybe, our son, who spent hours wet sanding and polishing will have caught the bug and want to keep a "Sprite" going on and on.





AHCSD events will have a sign-in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For multi-Healey families, be sure to indicate which car(s) you drove.

CotY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSD Meetings & Tech Sessions 4 pts; AHCSD driving Events, Parties etc. 6 pts; California Healey Week 16 pts; Healey Rendezvous 16 pts; Austin Healey Conclave 16 pts; S.D. British Car Day & Rolling B.C.D. 10 pts; Other non-AHCSD one day events 2 pts; Other non-AHCSD multi-day events 4pts. The Board on a case-by-case basis may award points for other events.


