


President's Message:

Sandy does not drive the Sprite or motor home, so she called the police and they sent an ambulance. Arrived at the emergency room at the hospital in San Luis Obispo. After all was said and done they figured out that I had broken my Clavicle. Nurse presented me a sling and sent us home.




CALIFORNIA HEALEY WEEK - MORROW BAY 2014



AHCSD events will have a sign-in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For multi-Healey families, be sure to indicate which car(s) you drove.

CotY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSD Meetings & Tech Sessions 4 pts; AHCSD driving Events, Parties etc. 6 pts; California Healey Week 16 pts; Healey Rendezvous 16 pts; Austin Healey Conclave 16 pts; S.D. British Car Day & Rolling B.C.D. 10 pts; Other non-AHCSD one day events 2 pts; Other non-AHCSD multi-day events 4pts. The Board on a case-by-case basis may award points for other events.
