


Hey there Healey Peeps

There is also another pile of litter under the differential, and cute stripes on my rear wheels. Something else is leaking. An inspection revealed perished rear wheel seals and gaskets on both sides and a leaking pinion seal.

The next step is to replace all the seals and gaskets and redo the rear brakes because the dead seals allowed differential oil to coat the brakes and make the drums useless to stop the car.

Hopefully it'll all get done before British Car Day.




