


Hey There Healey folks

That also means you can torque them past the original spec's of about 35-38Lbs. While the bolts may be stronger the thread in the chassis plates are not. So two of the bolts on both sides had been stripped out by over-torquing them. This required cutting out the old plates and welding in new ones!!

HAZARDOUS WASTE DISPOSAL

Living as we do on shaky ground, we need to make sure that we have taken the necessary precautions to protect ourselves and our investments in the most important part of the house - the garage. We all hear about how to earthquake-proof our houses, but they always tend to forget about the garage, even though there are quite a few of us who spend quite a considerable amount of time out of the house proper, and in the garage. There are a few simple things that we can do to protect our investments and ourselves in the event of an earthquake hitting.

First, remove all the heavy objects from upper shelves, and store at ground level. Large bulky items such as seasonal decorations can be stored in the overhead of the garage provided you span several rafters to distribute their weight and to stop them from slipping through between the joists. Do not over stack tools and other things on the storage shelves as they could fall off the shelf and cause injury, or worse yet, damage to our cars.

If your water heater is located in the garage, be sure that it is securely double strapped to studs in the wall, and make sure that it is attached to the gas supply with a flexible gas line and shutoff that will flex during a quake. Rigid lines can crack or break which could in turn cause a fire.

All hazardous materials should be segregated in well marked, unbreakable containers in a low cabinet with an earthquake proof latch, and keep a supply of kitty litter handy to soak up any spills that might occur in case of an accident.

Take the time to go through all your chemicals, paint and other hazardous materials, and it will surprise you how much of it is no longer needed. By disposing of these items you will have opened up space that was previously used and you will have removed a source of danger in an earthquake. Don't be tempted to dispose of this in the trash. The proper thing to do is to take your hazardous waste to one of the household hazardous waste collection centers. In Orange County there are 4, located at 1071 N. Blue Gum Street in Anaheim, at 6411 Oak Canyon in Irvine, at 17121 Nichols Street in Huntington Beach, and at the Prima Deshecha Landfill in San Juan Capistrano. The centers are open 9am to 1pm Tuesday through Saturday, and are closed on rainy days, and Christmas, Independence, Labor, Memorial, New Years and Thanksgiving days. The centers will accept oil and latex paint and paint products, automotive products, auto and household polish, household cleaners, wood preservatives, pesticides and herbicides, hobby and pool supplies, propane bar-b-q cylinders, unused road flares, smoke detectors, household batteries fluorescent lights and ballasts, mercury, medicines, cosmetics, and cathode ray tubes.

For City of San Diego residents a Household Hazardous Waste Transfer Facility is located at the Miramar Landfill Entrance on Convoy Street, just north of State Highway 52. For County residents there are Collection Facilities located in Ramona at 324 Maple Street, and in El Cajon at 1001 W Bradley Avenue. All 3 of these sites require appointments. Most Cities in San Diego County have their own disposal programs, and the information can be found at the following website. http://www.sdcounty.ca.gov/deh/hazmat/pdf/chd_hhw_contact.pdf

They will not accept biological waste, radioactive waste, ammunition, compressed gas cylinders, explosives, and asbestos. One option to dispose of these items is to take them out and dump them by the side of the road and then call the illegal dumping hotline, and report that you saw them



CotY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSO Meetings & Tech Sessions 4 pts; AHCSO driving Events, Parties etc. 6 pts; California Healey Week 16 pts; Healey Rendezvous 16 pts; Austin Healey Conclave 16 pts; S.D. British Car Day & Rolling B.C.D. 10 pts; Other non-AHCSO one day events 2 pts; Other non-AHCSO multi-day events 4pts. The Board on a case-by-case basis may award points for other events.
