Returning to my March tire story, the Borrego Desert tour was my first open road test with the recommended fifty-one pounds tire pressure.

So, What did I find out with the toe/in toe-out set at zero-zero? At speed, small steering wheel corrections can be magnified. It's not a serious problem, but it's definitely noticeable. Over corrections can seem like over reactions. The change is easy to get used to. My staid BJ8 becomes a slightly wild steed, like my favorite quarter horse, of years ago, when I would give her head.

Cornering is a different story. Keep in mind that I have installed Udo's Bilstien shocks years ago, which did away with the annoying "Healey Hop", most noticeable on rough surfaces, corners especially. The Coker-XWX Michelin's grab the road like they were designed to.

Years ago, Michelin designed the XWX's for the powerful Ferrari's, Maseratti's, Porsche's, Jaguar's and Panterra's of the 50's, 60's and 70's for speeds up to 140 MPH.. They have made my humble BJ8 handle much better, even at much more modest Healey speeds. Besides, they look cool. Like life, I pay my money and make my choice...

This months Anza-Borrego Desert drive missed the rusty and dusty desert fauna of Ricardo Breceda, the accidental metal sculpture artist. Too Bad. A construction worker, an injury and fate decided his new life path. His work is world renound with the largest consentration in Borrego. His desert dennisons go back to ancient habitants. His road to fame is interesting. And his art worth a second trip, for me, to see his works up close . Any takers?...

Our northernmost start point is at Kelly's Pub, 15817 Bernardo Center Drive, San Diego. We will have the use of the entire parking lot, and there will be food available to purchase. Owner DeeDee Kelly promises that she will have pastries, their famous breakfast burritos, and coffee available to quickly purchase and carry back out to the parking lot, to eat while you are kicking tires and sharing stories. Their kitchen opens at 7 am, if you would like to come early and eat sitting down. Please arrive by 9 am. We will roll out around 9:30.

Our southernmost start point is at Parkway Plaza West, we will gather at the parking lot in front of the Sprint store, 695 Fletcher Parkway, El Cajon. Directly across the street is a Panera Bread. Panera Bread has an extensive menu of muffins, pastries, breakfast sandwiches, coffees and teas. You can eat in, or take out, to join your friends in the parking lot, checking out cars. Panera Bread opens at 6 am, if you would like to arrive early and eat sitting down. Please arrive by 9 am. We will roll out around 9:30.

To Catch Willd Flowers In Bloom








Abundant winter rains have made this one of the best blooms in several years. And for us country types, plenty of weeds to get rid of before summer.

I met Gary Stalker, Lou Galper & Deborah Durham, Bob Humphreys, How-



CAR OF THE YEAR (COTY) AWARD

To recognize Club members who participate with their Healeys, the Austin Healey Club of San Diego awards CAR OF THE YEAR (COTY) points for various activities. Opportunities to collect COTY points include any car-related events (shows, drives, rallies, etc.) sponsored by an official organization (other car clubs, auto museum, city chambers of commerce, charities, etc.) where you participate with your Healey. Events need not be listed in the Club's newsletter to earn points.

The participant is responsible for providing proof of participation (entrance fee receipt, photo, corroboration from other club members etc.) to the Coty Recorder, Rick Snover (619-980-4194 <u>ricksnover@earthlink.net</u>) within 30 days after the event. AHCSD events will have a sign-in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For members with multiple eligible vehicles, be sure to indicate which one(s) you drove.

COTY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSD Meetings & Tech Sessions 4pts; AHCSD Driving Events, Parties, etc. 6pts; AHCSD Healeys on the Green 8pts; California Healey Week, Healey Rendezvous and Austin Healey Conclave 16pts; S.D. British Car Day and Rolling B.C.D. 10pts; other multi-day British-themed events 8pts; other multi-day events 4pts; other one-day British-themed events 4pts; other one-day events 2pts. Other non-Healey British-built cars earn half points, but are not eligible to win the award.

All points received during the year by all members will be worth a discount towards the purchase of AHCSD regalia during the subsequent year. The total point leader at the end of the year will receive the coveted CAR OF THE YEAR badge for display on their Healey for the following year.
