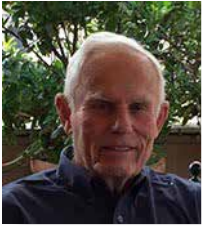

From The Editor:



I am happy to see **Foreign Speedo** return as an advertiser to Healey Hearsay. Years ago, I installed one of Mike Lambert's first run 3.54 ring and pinion differential (dif). gear sets. Actually, **Pro Gear** at 7948

Ronson Road, 858-571-1158, did the dif. set-up in another center section, with the new gears plus bearings, seals, and shims from **Moss**. Randy Zoller did the dif. installation. My Healey is definitely a lot happier at lower RPM's at speed.

The speedometer was off the difference between 3.93 and 3.54. The engine actually ran about 700 RPM's slower at the speed on the speedometer, which didn't match the road speed.

I had previously contacted **Foreign Speedo**, whom had rebuilt my Healey's speedometer. It had frozen up when the speedometer flex cable drive jambed. They also fixed a fine wire in my gas gauge, which separated. I had checked the sender, at the time, which was ok, OHM wise. Foreign Speedo found and fixed the problem.

To bring my speedometer in line with my new dif. gears, Foreign Speedo installed a tiny transmission in the speedometer cable line that changed the cable speed to match the new true road speed. (*No, there's no tiny shift lever.*) They put my Healey on a dino and changed gears in the tiny transmission to get my true speedometer road speed within 2 MPH.

Many, if not most of all the internal bits and pieces of our Lucas gauges are not available. Maybe they never were. The guys at Foreign Speedo have bins of obscure Lucas gauge parts, among others. So, if you have a gauge problem, talk to these guys. We've got to keep people like this in business...Our gauges seldom get the attention they eventually need. You don't want to try fixing this stuff yourself...believe me...

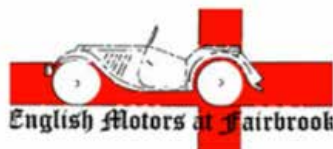

Campo Train Ride Saturday May 25th, 2019

You won't want to miss this event!

On May 25th (Saturday) the Healey Club will be taking a scenic drive to ride the Golden State train and visit the Pacific Southwest Railway Museum in Campo. We will meet at the Rancho Edwards Movie Theatre parking lot in Rancho San Diego - 2951 Jam-



acha Road and Campo Road at 8:30AM and drive the scenic route 94 to the Campo Train Depot. This ride is an approximate hour and a half (1.5 hrs.) ride. Once there, we will have time to park and buy tickets prior to the 11AM departure.

Tickets are \$18 per adult, \$15 age 65+ and \$9 ages 3-12. This includes the 45 minute round trip train ride through the beautiful and rugged back county and entrance to the museum. Food and drinks are allowed on the train and there is a picnic area and soda machine at the depot.

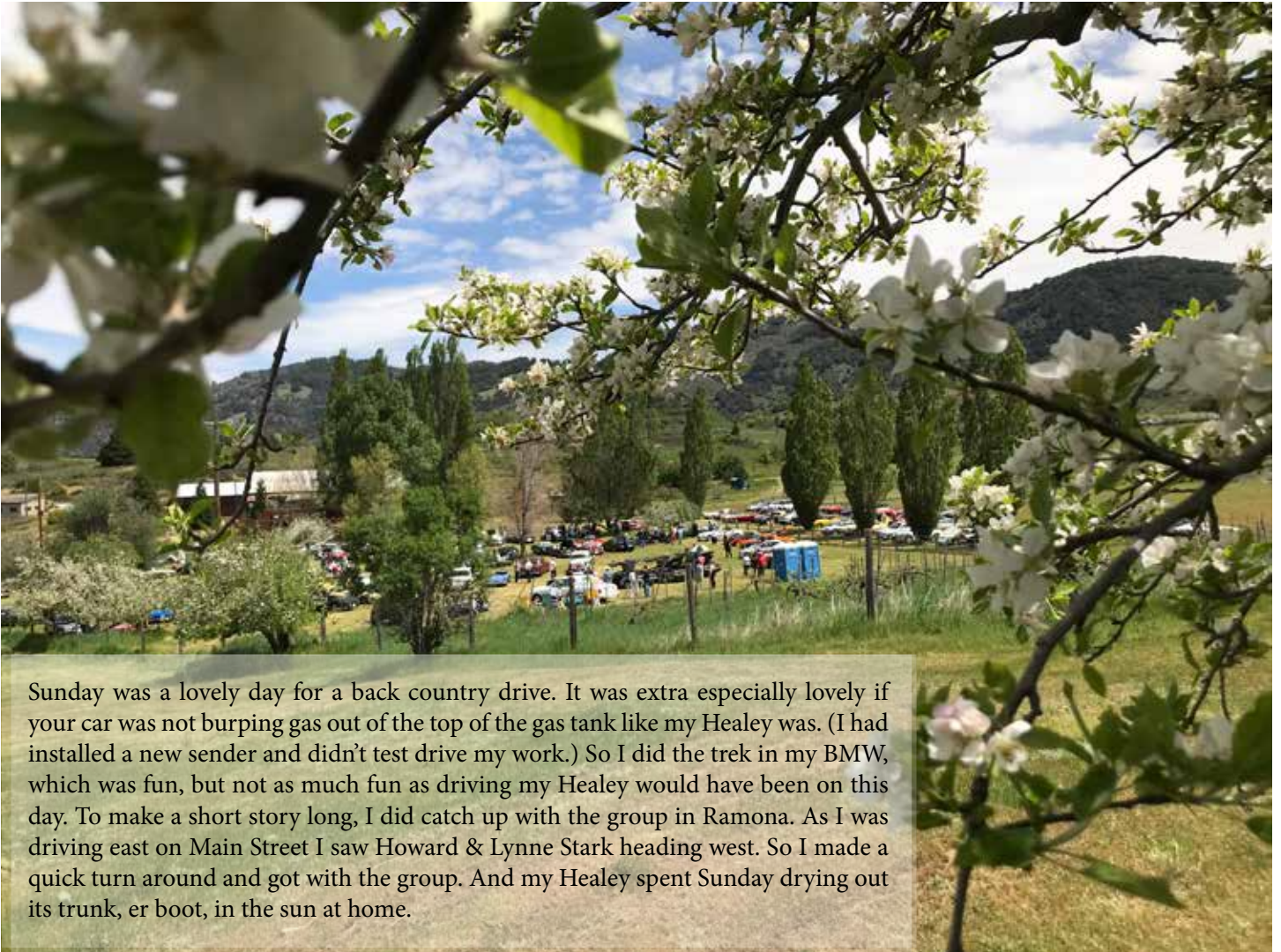

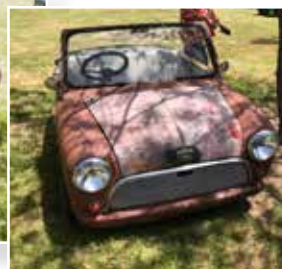

CAR OF THE YEAR (COTY) AWARD

To recognize Club members who participate with their Healeys, the Austin Healey Club of San Diego awards CAR OF THE YEAR (COTY) points for various activities. Opportunities to collect COTY points include any car-related events (shows, drives, rallies, etc.) sponsored by an official organization (other car clubs, auto museum, city chambers of commerce, charities, etc.) where you participate with your Healey. Events need not be listed in the Club's newsletter to earn points.

The participant is responsible for providing proof of participation (entrance fee receipt, photo, corroboration from other club members etc.) to the COTY Recorder, Rick Snover (619-980-4194 ricksnover@earthlink.net) within 30 days after the event. AHCSO events will have a sign-in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For members with multiple eligible vehicles, be sure to indicate which one(s) you drove.

COTY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSO Meetings & Tech Sessions 4pts; AHCSO Driving Events, Parties, etc. 6pts; AHCSO Healeys on the Green 8pts; California Healey Week, Healey Rendezvous and Austin Healey Conclave 16pts; S.D. British Car Day and Rolling B.C.D. 10pts; other multi-day British-themed events 8pts; other multi-day events 4pts; other one-day British-themed events 4pts; other one-day events 2pts. Other non-Healey British-built cars earn half points, but are not eligible to win the award.

All points received during the year by all members will be worth a discount towards the purchase of AHCSO regalia during the subsequent year. The total point leader at the end of the year will receive the coveted CAR OF THE YEAR badge for display on their Healey for the following year.
