Benke's Healey Gets Fahrspass

Tale of the Putzke's "Fahrspass" Bilstein Installation

As most of our members know, and I imagine a substantial number of Healev enthusiasts world wide know as well, Udo's selfmade kit for retrofitting modern shocks to any and all Healeys is a good story subject. Over a number of years in the Austin Healey Club of San Diego, I had been advised from time to time by Udo that he was running out of kits, and the new ones would be more expensive. I finally gave myself a Christmas present this year and bought possibly the last of Udo's stock. Then I innocently asked Udo where would be a good location for a club tech session to install the shock kit on my 1967 BJ8. Udo, bless his heart, said we should do it at his home so we could use his lift and tools needed. Without being too pushy, I man-



aged to work with him to reserve Saturday, March 12 for the tech session. I figured there would be a number of members who would be interested in seeing the product, and the installation process, and it would be good exposure for Udo's Fahrspass kit .

So, starting on Saturday the 12th about 8:45AM, the process began. Fortunately I had dropped my car off at Udo's on Friday afternoon, so he was able to assess some potential problems, and get the car on the lift to allow for a fast start on Saturday. 1st step, defeat the pressure on the

front Healey shocks, which physically remain intact to support the new shock mounting equipment. Udo quickly positioned the new parts and with a bit of help from club member Lex Dunn pushed and pulled the front shock assembly until the new bolts lined up and would go all the way through the old plate. Once tightened, the remaining new mounting parts easily went in, and the new shock placed! Easy. Basically the same procedure for the other side. By now, our tech group had grown. Besides Lex and myself, Doc McAllister was there. Warren arrived in his Healey and began taking photos. Then, Jeff Boysen, a new AHCSD member,

At Udo's Muffler Shop

but long time Healey owner came by in his nice black 1962 BT7. He had installed a Fahrspass kit on his car years earlier. Then Lou showed up in his 100-4 BN1. That was it for the team, and Udo seemed relieved the crowd was small, and number of hands-on were few. The more hands, the slower the going.

After a brief break, the right rear stock Healey shock was removed, keeping the leaf springs compressed with clamp, and new mounts readied for install. This is where the smooth sailing stopped as repositioning the fuel pump, a normal and necessary part of the shock conversion took all of Udo's talent and patience to finally get the shock mounts installed and the new Bilstein in place. The Left rear was another story. Basically, my after-market stainless exhaust pipes were

fabricated with a larger diameter tubing, like almost an extra half inch. So, we all watched Udo figure out how to re-rout one pipe over the other to eventually make room for the new shock. This meant sawing out a 24" section of the pipe, to be taken to the muffler shop of Udo's choice, on Monday. So, about 2:30PM that was the end of our Saturday tech session. We learned a lot about the install process and marveled at Udo's skills. We left with three out of 4 wheels on, and

assurances by Udo that he could and would have the car done and off the lift by Tuesday or Wednesday. It was Thursday, but he did it. I wish I could be more helpful during this process, but I know my involvement would have added days to the project. The car still has issues, but the ride is hugely improved. Thank you Udo!

My Healey Gets Bright Eyes...

I had been dissatisfied with my Healey's headlights for years. As I've mentioned, I live in the back country adjacent to a casino that may come with a lot of risk taking or bleary eyed, night time traffic, especially if you've spent all night at the tables. Or later, Lord forbid... Celebrating your good (or bad) fortune with a companion of the evening ...

New automotive lighting has long surpassed the sealed beam technology of the 30's and 40's to the point that it can be dangerous (in my opinion) to depend on sealed beams for night time driving, especially low or no ambient lit back country roads. The high powered LED or Xenon lights coming at you can blind you to everything but the oncoming LEDs and Xenon lights.

You may recall Udo Putzke's article, on installing LED's on their Healey, in the September 2019 issue of *Healey Hearesay*. I first considered redoing my wiring with relays to remove the power loss from the dash light switch. H4 bulbs draw 50 amps, which may heat up the dash switch. LED bulbs draw about 2 amps. After talking to those who have tried this and other solutions, and re-reading Udo's article, I finally purchased *STELLA LUX* LED conversion, from Moss Motors. Udo purchased the Supernova V.4s. Both are about the same price.

Again, carefully reading Udo's article. "On a rainy Sunday (with no rain)" the timing was almost perfect, except it was Sunday, and (gasp)raining! Gracious!... Would this cause a problem? NO!... Saints Alive!...The LED's could and can be installed on a Sunday with rain, (after service of course).

Before removing your headlamps, be sure to mark high and low beam heights on the garage door, as the instructions indicate. We used a 1x4 to mark the beam height, as it was raining outside, remember...It worked just as well.

The STELLA LUX instructions are as excellent as the product seems to be. When installing, pay particular attention the bulbs are installed in a twelve o'clock position as the dogs might not match the corresponding notches in the headlamp base. These LED's are designed for many 7- inch Lucas style headlamps.


The installation went fine until we came to the right headlamp socket which was melted to the point of shorting out. We had to scrounge around El Cajon automotive parts shops to find a replacement until we finally found one pre-wired. We solder spliced it in after sliding shrink insulation over and shrunk it with a fireplace lighter. I've included a source for plugs on Amazon if yours need replacing.



NOTE If you already are using H4 Halogen bulbs, you don't have to purchase new lenzes. Your existing lenzes will work with STELLA LUX

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CAR OF THE YEAR (COTY) AWARD

Opportunities to collect COTY points include any car-related events (shows, drives, rallies, etc.) sponsored by an official organization (other car clubs, auto museum, city chambers of commerce, charities, etc.) where you participate with your Healey. Events need not be listed in the Club's newsletter to earn points.

The participant is responsible for providing proof of participation (entrance fee receipt, photo, corroboration from other club members etc.) to the Coty Recorder, Rick Snover (619-980-4194 ricksnover@earthlink.net) within 30 days after the event. AHCSD events will have a sign-in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For members with multiple eligible vehicles, be sure to indicate which one(s) you drove.

Coty points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSD Meetings & Tech Sessions 4pts; AHCSD Driving Events, Parties, etc. 6pts; AHCSD Healeys on the Green 8pts; California Healey Week, Healey Rendezvous and Austin Healey Conclave 16pts; S.D. British Car Day and Rolling B.C.D. 10pts; other multi-day British-themed events 8pts; other multi-day events 4pts; other one-day British-themed events 4pts; other one-day events 2pts. Other non-Healey British-built cars earn half points, but are not eligible to win the award.

All points received during the year by all members will be worth a discount towards the purchase of AHCSD regalia during the subsequent year. The total point leader at the end of the year will receive the coveted CAR OF THE YEAR badge for display
