From The Editor:



hinking about the Fahrspass shock installation on the Benke's Healey, last month, I installed Putzke's Fahrspass Bilstein shocks on my Healey in 1999, after my engine rebuild. I recall driving into town, with only the front wheel shocks installed. I removed the dis-

abling Armstrong shock valves as required. The shock fluid became a lubricant. My Healeys front end felt *"different and springy"*. I think it had a smile on its grille, with a sigh of relief, after sustaining thirty- three years of pavement pounding. I think I had a smile on my grille too...

I recall years of the famous "Healey Hop" and "scuttle shake" taking corners on winding twisty roads. I would say my Armstrong shocks were in average shape for my Healeys age. I kept them topped off with recommended shock fluid. The rear shocks were especially a pain as they were inconvenient to get at. I would check the shock mount bolts at the same time. I recall the left front starting to leak a little. You know...Not bad..."*still good enough*".

I believe I purchased the second or third set of BJ8 shocks as they required a modified bracket for the fuel pump that was recently fabricated when I first inquired. I recall the installation instructions were not finished, so I called Udo for information as needed. Unlike Don's installation, there was no conflict on the rear shock installation and the exhaust pipe. The change out of the factory fuel pump bracket with the modified Fahrpass went smoothly.

I removed both back seat bottoms which greatly helped with the rear shock installation. I never reattached the the bottoms, with the four fixed bolts per seat. Simply pressing them in place was more than adiquate. The bonus is that later this allowed for an easy fuel pump replacement as well as replacing the electrical loom on the other side.

I have now had Fahrpass Shocks on my Healey for twenty three years. They have added safety, drivability, and improved handling. My Healey and I are still smiling...



CAUSES OF BREAKDOWNS

Most of us are members of the AAA, and as such we depend on them to get us home safely if we have problems with our cars while out on the road.

This is also the case in Britain, where there were 3 motoring organizations that have been looking after the mo-



torist for over 100 years. The Automobile Association is the youngest of the three and was founded in London in 1906. The Royal Scottish Automobile Club was founded in Glasgow in 1899, and the oldest of the 3 is the Royal Automobile Club founded in 1897.

One of the things that the RAC has done is to maintain records since 1926 concerning their "Get-You-



Home" service. In their records they have tracked the causes of breakdowns on a yearly basis. The 1926 record gives us a good idea which parts of our cars are most liable to give us problems and by addressing these areas hopefully it will ensure that we can avoid being broken down on the road.

Over 80 percent of the problem areas are mechanical, with another 14 percent of the problems being attributed to human error, namely accidents. The main categories are:

- Ignition 22.5%
- Engine 21.5%
- Rear axle shaft 12.6%
- Transmission & clutch 11.8%
- Road Wheels & suspension 5.9%
- Front axle & steering 4.3%
- Carburetor 2.5%
- Accident 14.1%



This list does not include things such as electrical "A Day in the Life of a British Car Owner"

or lighting failure, running out of gas, or leaking radiators, and these are most likely to be the other 5-6 percent of the problem areas.

We can't solve all the potential problems with our cars, but with proper preventative maintenance we can reduce the possibility to an acceptable level, and if needed, we can always call on AAA for help.

A word of advice if you do have to call, please be patient with them as they have a whole bunch of questions that they will ask in order to make sure that they get the right car. You might know that your car is the only 1909 Buick, 1914 Model T, or 1963 Healey at your location, but the operator on the other end of the phone line needs to make sure that the tow truck driver can find you, so they need to know all the necessary information including the colour of your car...





CAR OF THE YEAR (COTY) AWARD



To recognize Club members who participate with their Healeys, the Austin Healey Club of San Diego awards CAR OF THE YEAR (COTY) points for various activities. Opportunities to collect COTY points include any car-related events (shows, drives, rallies, etc.) sponsored by an official organization (other car clubs, auto museum, city chambers of commerce, charities, etc.) where you participate with your Healey. Events need not be listed in the Club's newsletter to earn points.

The participant is responsible for providing proof of participation (entrance fee receipt, photo, corroboration from other club members etc.) to the COTY Recorder, Rick Snover (619-980-4194 <u>ricksnover@earthlink.net</u>) within 30 days after the event. AHCSD events will have a sign-in sheet that will be forwarded to the recorder. For members with multiple eligible vehicles, be sure to indicate which one(s) you drove.

COTY points currently approved by the Board are: AHCSD Meetings & Tech Sessions 4pts; AHCSD Driving Events, Parties, etc. 6pts; AHCSD Healeys on the Green 8pts; California Healey Week, Healey Rendezvous and Austin Healey Conclave 16pts; S.D. British Car Day and Rolling B.C.D. 10pts; other multi-day British-themed events 8pts; other multi-day events 4pts; other one-day British-themed events 4pts; other one-day events 2pts. Other non-Healey British-built cars earn half points, but are not eligible to win the award.

All points received during the year by all members will be worth a discount towards the purchase of AHCSD regalia during the subsequent year. The total point leader at the end of the year will receive the coveted CAR OF THE YEAR badge for display on their Healey for the following year.
