t's the day before Memorial Day. The Club and Club-member connection made me think of my good friend and Club member Ralph Merritte, who passed away almost 20 years ago. Long time members may remember

two articles I did on Ralph and the Healey family he knew from the early days of the Healey marque. I ran this article in the June 2018 Healey Hearsay. (I might run the stories as well, as fillers.) I would never have run this article while Ralph was alive as it would have been an invasion of his privacy...At that time of this story, Ralph would have been about 14 years older than I...

There is another part of Ralph...his experience as a ball turret gunner in B17's and B24's during WWII. This was and still is amazing to me, as my military expe-



rience, had I had any, would have been during the Pax Americana, when the world was more or less at peace...If you could count the Cold War as peace... Ralph related the following to me...

When Ralph joined the Army Air Force, in the early 1940's, he was assigned as

a ball turret gunner. His size qualified him as he was small enough to fit in a ball turret. And in the Air Force, that was that. This worked out well as he was an avid trap and skeet shooter. And this was his training...to shoot trap at the base range, days on end, practicing leading a new target, in his case an Me109, that would fly into a cloud of bullets from the two 50 cal. BMG's,


Hello everybody.

The Sperry ball turret had a hatch for the gunners entry/ exit and maintenance. The ball could be raised and lowered in and out of the fuselage

hydraulically. And it could also be raised manually case of electrical or hydraulic failure. The gunner, who entered the when turret the guns were pointing down in flight, was in a fetal position, between the guns, his feet stirrups, which were also controls. He was not in the ball on take-off and





landing. B24's had a fully retractable mount because of low ground clearance.

Ralph described a typical mission as follows...The flight from Brize Norton, in south-west England, to the intended target was usually "seven or eight hours of freezing cold, boredom, and thinking what was ahead". As the squadron approached, the Me109's would be waiting for them as they entered enemy

airspace. He would track the enemy with his guns, holding them at bay, as they both were angling for an easy kill. If the mission survived that, closer to the target was usually a ring of enemy 88MM flak guns. As the captain handed the controls to the bombardier, the boredom became "abject terror" of the Me109 cannon and the 88MM flack rattling against, and ripping through, the planes thin aluminum skin. They were an exposed target for about half an hour as they began their bomb run. Then, hopefully, again, the long boring return flight to Brize Norton and rest..

One day, on the way back to Ralph's home in my Healey, after one of our lunches, he began talking as if I wasn't there. I caught a corner of his face in the rear view mirror and looked away as I couldn't bear to look. He mentioned the trauma of the of planes and crew he saw go down, lost in action, or on the way back, and men and boys he knew, and never saw again....And how, and why, fortune favored him,...making it through,...when so many didn't...

Ralph and I always enjoyed lunch, at least once a month, at Saigon, an Asian restaurant on El Cajon Blvd, or DZ Akins for matzo ball soup and pastrami sandwiches. And reminiscing about his car being the fourth factory production Austin Healey 100. And driving it through out Europe after the war. How he wished he still had it. He gave me his cloisonné Healey grille badge, given him by "the Healey's".

As I Said, I would never have mentioned any of this while Ralph was alive as he was quite private about it, especially the mental flashbacks, which he said were always with him, still, after all those years. I was surprised, and honored, he was open on this to me. He never thought of himself as anything special. Those were the ones who never came back...

Palm Springs Healey Tour at Heritage Trim

During our week in Palm Springs, I arranged a tour at Heritage Trim. For many years, Heritage has been known for Concours quality upholstery for Healeys and other British cars. Although they were originally located in Vancouver, B.C., the owner relocated to Palm Springs a couple of years ago.

During a previous visit, the owner, Tony, told me he moved for the warm weather, and was pleased to find local workers who could meet his high standards. He proudly told our group that he provides the best product available, and that

his prices reflect that, being about 50% higher than competitors. He mentioned that he has a lot of work in progress for Jaguar, Porsche and Mercedes. He is doing the Jaguar upholstery that Moss sells, and there was a number of boxes marked 'Moss Motors'.

He showed us the CAD/CNC machine used to cut patterns and some samples of work in progress, mentioning he can provide any Healey upholstery or trim (panels and dash pads) made to the highest standards. He showed us seat heaters which they sell or can be incorporated into any of the seats they produce.

Customers can send in their complete seats for re-upholstery or buy a kit that has all the

components, including their own custom-made foam cushions and backs, exactly duplicating the original seats, with small improvements to the firmness. Note: I bought a kit from them years ago, and had it fitted locally. Seats still look excellent, no wrinkles.


